MORE THAN 100 BABIES traveled safely as they left Community's care thanks to your support of our free car seat program

MORE THAN 800 PARENTS participated in infant education classes and attended prenatal visits, allowing them to earn vouchers for Community's B.A.B.E. store to redeem items needed to raise a healthy baby—cribs, diapers, car seats and more



NEARLY 500 VOUCHERS valued at \$250 each were distributed to cancer patients in financial need to ensure they have access to healthy food, life-saving medicine and gas to get to and from treatment

THOUSANDS OF HEALTHY MEALS were provided to seniors in need, enriching their health and preserving their dignity

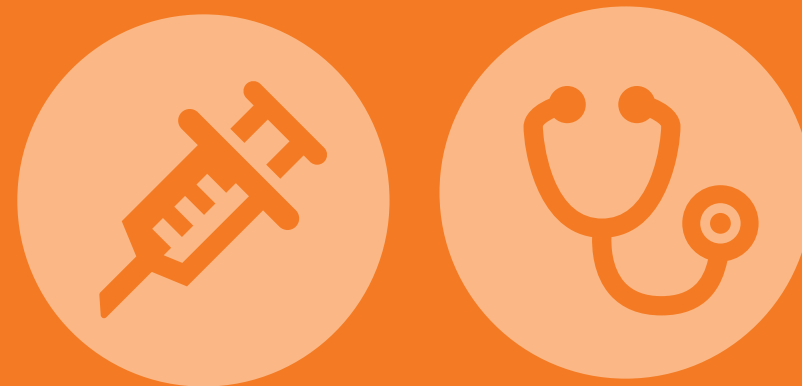
675 INDIVIDUALS on the east side received free flu vaccines, and more than 1,300 people received critical health screenings at the INShape Black and Minority Health Fair

HEALING

NEARLY 2,000 CANCER PATIENTS received additional healing help through integrative oncology programs which include yoga, massage and tai chi

60 VICTIMS of sexual assault received free medication to prevent HIV, while a number of other victims of assault, abuse or neglect received life-changing help from Community's specially trained nurses at our Center of Hope
