

Community Hospital Anderson Unit Descriptions

Unit Name	No. of Beds	Description
Orthopedic/Neurology/Spine (2E)	25	Orthopedic, neurology and spine patients. Neurology patient types include CVA and seizures.
Telemetry Unit (3E)	29	Patients include chest pain, atrial fibrillation, COPD, CHF, bronchitis and pneumonia.
Intensive Care Unit (4E)	17	Patients include cardiac arrest, respiratory failure, ventilator support, multisystem failure, electrolyte imbalance, complicated surgeries, sepsis, renal failure and neurosurgeries.
Inpatient Surgical Unit (5E)	25	Unit with post-operative surgical patients: open cholecystectomy, urological, colon-rectal. Medical patients include: abdominal pain, diverticulitis, sepsis, renal failure, UTI, dehydration, bowel obstruction, anemia, cellulitis, kidney stones and cancer.
Emergency Department	19 beds and 2-bed trauma room	24-hour emergency care for serious and sudden illness and/or injury & trauma. Joint Commission recognized stroke care. Board-certified emergency physicians. State-verified level III trauma center.
Maternity Services	16	Labor, delivery, recovery, postpartum and antepartum patients. Women are admitted to the Maternity Unit where they stay for their entire labor, delivery and recovery experience. Includes a level II NICU with 6 beds.
Short Stay	Varies	Outpatient procedure unit. Procedures include blood transfusions, lumbar punctures, bone marrow biopsy, IV antibiotics, IGG administration and post-procedure care from interventional radiology or angiography.
Surgery (inpatient): Students float between PACU, SDS & OR		Performs both outpatient and inpatient procedures. Surgical procedures include the DaVinci Robotic Surgical System utilized for laparoscopic procedures. Other surgeries include: appendectomy, cholecystectomy, colon resection, spinal fusion, total joint replacement and nephrectomy.
Cardiac Cath Lab/Day Beds		Angioplasty and stent placement
Outpatient Wound Center		Hyperbaric oxygen therapy, debridement, and special dressings and wraps to assist in healing chronic wounds and open sores.
Outpatient Diabetic Center		Diabetic services and patient education.
