

### *Community Hospital North Unit Descriptions*

<b><i>Unit Name</i></b>	<b><i>No. of Beds</i></b>	<b><i>Description</i></b>
<b>Intensive Care Unit</b>	24	Patients include cardiac arrest, respiratory failure, ventilator support, multisystem failure, electrolyte imbalance, complicated surgeries, sepsis, renal failure and neurosurgeries.
<b>Progressive Care Unit</b>	32	Complex patient population which include congestive heart failure, renal failure, GI bleeding, drug overdose, bariatric and neurology patients.
<b>Medical Renal Oncology</b>	48	Medical unit with diabetic, oncology, COPD and renal failure patients.
<b>Orthopedic/Neurology/Spine</b>	30	Orthopedic, neurology and spine patients and with a 12-bed Center for Joint Health which includes total joint replacements for knees and hips. Neurology patient types include CVA, seizures and 24-hour outpatient video EEG.
<b>Inpatient Surgical Unit (G-2):</b>	48	Unit with post-operative surgical patients: gynecological, urological, colon-rectal.
<b>Maternity Services:</b>	60	LDRP which includes ante partum patients. Women are admitted to the Maternity Unit where they stay for their entire labor, delivery and recovery experience.
<b>Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU):</b>	48	NICU provides care for high-risk neonates from 23-week gestation through 28 days post term. The unit includes 4 rooms for twins and 1 room for triplets. The most common reason for admission is respiratory distress and prematurity.
<b>Pediatrics:</b>	20	Patients (age 0 to 17) include both ambulatory as well as inpatients. The unit has 2 sleep center beds. A surgical clinic is held on Tuesdays and Fridays as well as a Synagis Clinic held from November to April. The most common diagnoses are respiratory and GI.
<b>Pediatric ICU capable beds</b>	4	Common diagnosis respiratory. The PICU is capable of caring for patients on high flow nasal oxygen, BiPAP and conventional ventilators
<b>Observation Unit</b>	15	All ED admissions and direct admits for a med-surg level of care are on this unit prior to transfer to the specific med-surg unit. In addition, all med-surg observation patients are admitted to this unit as well.

<b>Infusion Unit</b>	10	Outpatient procedure unit. Procedures include blood transfusions, lumbar punctures, bone marrow biopsy, IV antibiotics, IGG administration, post-procedure care from interventional radiology or angiography.
<b>Surgery (inpatient):</b>	8 suites	Performs both outpatient and inpatient procedures, averaging between 25 and 30 procedures a day. Surgical procedures include gastric bypass, lap band procedures as part of the bariatric programs, as well as the DaVinci Robotic Surgical System used for laparoscopic prostatectomies and hysterectomies. Other surgeries include: colon resection, spinal fusion, craniotomies, total joint replacement and nephrectomies
<b>Community Surgery Center North (outpatient)</b>	9 suites	Multi-specialty outpatient surgery center performing over 11,000 procedures annually. The center has a 24-hour stay unit for extended recovery. Procedures are as small as ear tubes and as acute as spinal surgery and laparoscopic vaginal hysterectomies.
<b>Emergency Department:</b>	26 Beds and 2 Shock Rooms	A paramedic receiving, non trauma, Emergency Department which sees about 130 patients/day for all age groups.
